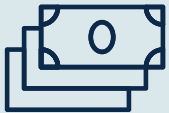

Certifications

- OUPV "6 Pack" License for operating vessels with 6 or less passengers for hire.
- Masters License for operating vessels with more than 6 passengers up to 100 Gross Tons.
- Assistance Towing Endorsement for towing disabled vessels.

**The Captain's License Program** allows individuals to operate and tow vessels with passengers and cargo. This license will allow individuals to work around fishing charters, dive boats, sightseeing boats, ferries, and sailing charters. All US Coast Guard subjects are covered including Rules of the Road, Navigation, Plotting, Firefighting, Communications, Aids to Navigation, Rules and Regulations and more.
